It is gratifying that the campus, with its classrooms, libraries, laboratories, sports grounds, cultural hubs, hostels, etc looks vibrant and is able to attract people from within the state of Jharkhand as well as neighbouring states inquiring about our academic programmes. The University is gaining importance in the nearby region as a means to fulfil the aspirations of local youths interested in higher studies and research. Besides, the local youths are motivated through education and training to change their livelihood.

As a part of our vision and commitment to the goal of achieving academic excellence, our University has set up a cluster of colleges on- campus starting from engineering and technology, polytechnic, medical, nursing, pharmacy, paramedical, education and physical education, library and information science, arts, science, commerce and management. The University is able to fill-in the MBBS seats in Session 2023-24.

Another indicator of the robust academic activity in our University is the implementation of NEP-2020 w.e.f. A.Y. 2023-24 and introduction of industry specific courses including hands-on practices, skills development initiatives, etc leading to skills up-gradation for increased employability. The launching of Ph.D. programmes in selected area(s) in 2019-20 session is a milestone to provide ambitious and qualified teachers to guide research scholars for their own satisfaction, and also, to introduce research culture for enhanced teaching-learning practices.

Certain courses viz. MA (youth development), MA (women development & empowerment), Master's in Rural Development, Diploma (disaster management), Diploma (logistics and supply chain management), Diploma (alternate energy management), Diploma (water resource management), etc have been consistently in larger demand for the sake of increased industrial requirements; and the University is committed to launch such programmes.

The industry-institute interaction has priority in terms of inviting industries on-campus to train teachers and students. Also, this has resulted in good on-campus placements of students.

The RCU nursing college students are very active in extending the community health services and conduct of out-reach programmes. Regular immunization drives, maternity, childcare as well as treatment of minor ailments, emergency cases and referral services are regularly carried out on priority. Whereas the University organizes class room activities as per the time table and lecture plan in each subject, the teaching-learning process is well geared-up with the lectures followed by discussions, seminars, symposia, panel discussions, debates, quizzes, etc.

## 1. About Ramchandra Chandravansi University

The establishment of the Ramchandra Chandravansi University (RCU) is through an Act in the state of Jharkhand (Jharkhand Act, 10, 2018) vide Jharkhand Gazette Notification No. 903 dated 24-Sept-2018. The setting up of RCU has been promoted by Ramchandra Chandravansi Welfare Trust (RCWT) which was registered in the year 2006. Since its inception, the mission of founding fathers has been to spread education to ordinary citizens of India, particularly those hailing from backward regions of the state of Jharkhand and India. With very humble beginning of two intermediate colleges 15 years back, RCWT has transformed itself into diverse and excellent educational complex of technical, professional, vocational and medical related academic institutions.

Having realized the challenges being faced in spread of higher education in respect of the backward regions of Garhwa and Palamu, RCWT has developed a culture of sensitizing and providing encouragement at the entry level of University so that boys and girls develop confidence and participate in quality education.

❖ To become a leader in providing quality education in engineering, medical, vocational and other diverse disciplines in the state of Jharkhand in general and backward regions of the country in particular.

#### **MISSION:**

- ❖ To take affirmative action for increasing access of ordinary common Indian men, women, physically challenged and economically deprived section of society to diverse fields of education covering engineering, medical, vocational and other diverse disciplines at undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral levels.
- ❖ To establish different state-of-the-art institutions for ensuring proper linkages between planning of professional education facilities and the market demand so that the university become demand driven, meet the needs of the economy and become important technological hub of the country.
- ❖ To create infrastructure for curricular and co-curricular activities in different fields of education for all round development of the students hailing from both rural and urban areas.
- ❖ To develop human potential to its fullest extent so that intellectually capable and imaginative3ly gifted leaders can emerge in a range of professions.

### 2. Aims & Objectives of the University

- ❖ To impart higher education and to enable research towards capacity building for creation of trained manpower in the remote location of state of Jharkhand in engineering, medicine, pharmacy, nursing, education, management, arts, science and commerce fields and others areas of higher learning vital for empowering men and women in the region and improving their quality of life.
- ❖ To contribute to the promotion of regional development and vision by bringing together the gram pradhan(s) in local areas and the concerned district level authorities, who by virtue of their past understanding can enhance their support to focus on impact of education in the development of courses and curricula relevant to need based and location specific thrust areas for raising employability.
- ❖ To harmonize the academic standards and accreditation norms in teaching, research and curriculum that are acceptable to all stake holders.
- ❖ To create a unique partnership between the scholars and interested persons from the industries and research organizations.
- ❖ To understand the local tribal needs and way of teaching in the contemporary context without excluding any other thoughts and practices from any other part of India.
- ❖ To enhance research for greater interaction between neighboring states, particularly between bordering states with Jharkhand, bound by strong interactions in areas like trade, science and commerce, industry, religion, philosophy and cross- cultural traditions.
- ❖ To foster in the students and scholars the spirit of accommodation, understanding and thus to train them to become exemplary citizens of democratic societies.
- ❖ To contribute to the improvement of the educational system prevalent in the state of Jharkhand in view of strengthening the teaching needs of Palamu.
- ❖ To provide education and training orientation in various arts, crafts and skills in accordance with the background of the local people for upskilling and improving their usefulness.

### 3. The RCU Governance System

The operational structure of the University Governance System is shown in Figure 1. The key functionaries are the Chancellor, Vice Chancellor, Deans of Faculty of Studies, Dean (A&R), Principals of Colleges, Registrar and Controller of Examinations (CoE). However, the four major bodies through which the policy decisions are usually taken and/or executed are vested in the authorities as here under:


- i. The **Governing Body** (GB) headed by the Chancellor (Table-1).
- ii. The **Board of Management** (BoM) headed by the Vice Chancellor (Table-2).
- iii. The **Academic Council** (AC) headed by the Vice Chancellor (Table-3).
- iv. The **Finance Committee** (FC) headed by the Vice Chancellor (Table-4).

Whereas the GB under the Chairmanship of the Chancellor is empowered to take policy decisions, for implementation of the policy decisions the Vice Chancellor and Teams(s) have to depend on bodies like BoM, AC and FC. The composition of the GB, BoM, AC & FC has been shown in Tables 1 - 4.
